	East Devon - Innovation & Resilience Fund- targeted at East Devon businesses. Project proposals don't 'have' to be green focussed, but it is very much prioritised in the scoring matrix and so roughly 50%+ of all submissions cite specific carbon reduction implications of their projects. The Devon Net Zero Innovation Fund – funding up to £7,500 per enterprise. Plymouth City Council's Workplace travel grant - match-funded grants with the Council investing up to £25,000, per site, in a scheme that reduces the environmental impact of your business travel. The Council's contribution is a maximum of 75% of the pre-VAT scheme cost Workplace travel grants PLYMOUTH.GOV.UK
